

SLOW COOKER BRISKET

Brisket rub:

- 3T paprika
- 2T black pepper
- 2T salt
- 1T brown sugar
- 1t chili powder
- 1t ground cumin

BBQ sauce:

- 3/4c bbq sauce (your favorite)
- 1/4c water
- 1T Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4t liquid smoke
- 1/2 onion-sliced into rings



Use about 2 pounds of beef brisket for this recipe.

Mix all rub ingredients in a bowl, rub evenly over the surface of the brisket and place in baggie for at least 30 minutes-over night is even better.

Stir bbq sauce, water, Worcestershire sauce and liquid smoke together in the bottom of the slow cooker, lay the brisket into the sauce mixture and arrange the onions on top of brisket.

Cook on low until brisket is very tender, 6 to 7 hours. Rest the brisket about 10 minutes before slicing or shredding, serve with the sauce left in the slow cooker.
